
Is That a Real Service Dog?

DOGS


Any dog trained to perform tasks for an individual with a physical or psychiatric disability.



EMOTIONAL

SUPPORT DOGS

Provides comfort to a person with a mental illness/disability.



THERAPY

DOGS

Provides therapy in hospitals, nursing homes, assisted living centers, schools, etc.

Is Training Required?

YES - Service dogs must be task trained to mitigate a person's disability.

NO - Emotional support dogs do not require training.

YES - Therapy dogs receive obedience training and are selected for their temperaments.

Are They Allowed in Public Places?

YES - Service dogs are generally allowed in public places through the Americans with Disabilities Act.

NO - Emotional support dogs are only allowed in non-pet housing and on airplanes.

NO - However, therapy dogs are allowed in public places when invited.
